At the moment we are having free school meals provided by Thorntons Caterers who will be taking over the new kitchens at Rockingham Primary School. The proposed charges for hot meals will be £1.90 to £2.00. However, looking at the present packed lunches that are being received the diet looks much more varied, healthy and well presented. Towards the end of term I will arrange for the caterer to come into school to meet with the parents and children and possibly provide a meal for you to sample.

SNACKS

Last year the school received the Healthy Schools award for following the Government laws and regulations on providing healthy foods in school. Recently we have noticed that children are taking sweets, biscuits and crisps from their packed lunches out to eat at playtime. This is not allowed. All national schools from September 2007 were told to abide by the new "Food in schools laws". (a copy can be viewed outside the Office) We are allowed to provide a snack but it has to be within the list of acceptable foods. Children may, however, eat a wider variety of foods at lunchtime and after school. We ask for 20p a day towards the EYU snacks and KS2 children may spend up to 40p on the snack trolley. From 6th May no playtime snacks, other than those provided by the school, or water, will be allowed at playtimes. Please support us with this as we do provide as wide a variety of snacks as allowable and try to keep your children healthy.

AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS.

IF YOUR CHILD HAS PAID FOR A TERM'S AFTER SCHOOL CLUBS AND THEN TAKES PART IN A SCHOOL EVENT WHICH MEANS THEY MISS THEIR CLUB, WE ARE UNABLE TO RETURN YOUR MONEY. HOWEVER, WE ARE HAPPY TO CARRY THE CREDIT FORWARD AND FOR YOU TO DEDUCT THIS FROM THE NEXT TERM'S PAYMENTS. THIS CANNOT BE DONE FOR ABSENCE, HOWEVER, AS STAFF WHO RUN THE CLUBS STILL NEED TO BE PAID FOR RUNNING THE CLUBS. WE APPRECIATE THE PROBLEM BUT CANNOT OVERCOME IT. OUR TEACHERS WHO TAKE THE TEAMS ALSO HAVE DIFFICULTIES WHEN MATCHES ENCROACH ON THEIR CLUBS BUT DO NOT WANT CHILDREN TO MISS THE MATCHES WHICH THEY WANT TO TAKE PART IN. WE STRIVE TO WORK IN PARTNERSHIP WITH YOU.
