Activities to do with your children

Every week your child has a list of spellings to learn. Here are a few ways of helping them to learn these words and use them in their speaking and writing.

Encourage your child to use the words in a spoken sentence. Ask them to vary the subject matter and content to give a variety of sentences.

Rather than just writing the spellings out in a list, ask your child to write a sentence for each word, checking the spelling of the word in the sentence.

Try to use the words in general conversation and encourage your child to do the same.

Ask your child to write sentences for the words they learnt last week. How many can they remember?

How to run a revolting bath, by Tom Barnard
