Science off the Page

Also on Thursday the 7th, Centaur class learnt all about "Prey and Predators". They learnt all about owls; how they hunt, how they eat and digest their food. We examined owl pellets by carefully pulling them apart and examining the skeletons on the animals the owls had eaten. We then had to identify which bits of bones were skulls, which were arm bones, leg bones, hips or ribs. It was like a jigsaw!

In the afternoon, we learnt about food chains, producers and consumers. We learnt that an owl is an apex predator. We had lots of fun and got nice and messy with the clay, building food chains.
